As you speak of visiting England,  
I would recommend your doing so at the earliest  
convenient opportunity. The Collection of Indian  
Manuscripts, of Sanscrit especially, in the library of  
the East India Company, is ample; & if you would  
find the time, you may be able to spare for the  
examination of them, very fruitfully employed.  
No catalogue of this Collection has been printed.

A catalogue of books & manus-  
cripts in the British Museum, concerning which  
you enquire, exists; but the collection of  
Indian Manuscripts there is very scanty. The  
Royal Society possesses the Manuscripts collected  
by the late Sir William Jones. It is the only  
considerable Collection open to the public,
