Dear Sir,

I find upon examination with Dr. Williams, Librarian of the Radcliffe Library, that there are some Sanscrit MSS. in that Library, which formerly belonged to Fraser. There is no doubt that they are the same as those indicated in Fraser's Nadir-Shah, and they are, as is there represented, all in loose leaves. Whether all the MSS. mentioned by him are now preserved in that Library I do not know, but I am inclined to think that is not the case. We found only three not very large packets of loose leaves. It had suggested itself to me that Fraser's Sanscrit MSS. were in the Radcliffe Library together with his other Oriental ones, before I received your last letter, although Dr. Williams assured me they were not to the best of his knowledge. Dr. W. desires me to say he will be happy to furnish Mr. Schlegel every facility to the examination of what ever Oriental MSS. he has under his custody.
