So hat das Suchen der Kläger in der angebrachten Maasse nicht statt, es sind auch die Kläger die dem Beklagten durch diesen Rechtsstreit verursachten Unkosten zu restituieren gehalten.

Im Uebrigen ist auf Antrag des Beklagten mit der Wiederaufhebung der in den eingangsangezogenen Acten von dem Proceßgericht erlassenen Arrestverfügung zu verfahren.

Die Extrajudicialien Bl. 41 b. fg. sub a. sind zur Zeit und unter Ausscheidung sowohl der illiquiden, als auch der nicht in die vorliegenden Proceßacten gehörigen Ansätze auf zusammen 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ festzustellen, wogegen es zur Feststellung der Bl. 42. sub b. beigefügten Beträge zunächst des Belegs durch die Privatacten bedarf. Die Bl. 49. unter a. verzeichneten Anwaltskosten bleiben ebenso, wie die Gerichtskosten Bl. 19 b. und 49 b. ohne Ermäßigung.
