

Am 17/29. April feierte Herr G. A. Reyher in Mitau das funfzigjährige Jubiläum seiner um die Förderung des wissenschaftlichen Lebens in den Ostseeprovinzen sehr verdienstvollen Wirksamkeit, wozu zahlreiche Glückwünsche von nah und fern, darunter auch seitens des Börsenvorstandes, eingegangen sind. Der Jubilar, aus Wenden gebürtig, trat 1813 bei Hartmann in Riga in die Lehre. Späterhin wurde er von Deubner & Trey in Riga, welche damals in Mitau die einzige Buchhandlung besaßen, zur Leitung dieses Geschäftes berufen. Diese Stelle bekleidete Reyher bis zum Jahre 1826, wo nach dem Tode von Trey das ganze Geschäft selbstständig auf ihn überging und der Grund zu einer der angesehensten Firmen des heutigen Buchhandels gelegt wurde.
