Since this Grammar was first published the Hindi translation of the Sanskrit drama of Shakuntala, by Raja Lachhman Sinh, has taken

the place of the Prem Ságar in the Civil Service Examinations, and in the new edition of the Grammar the former work has been largely substituted for the latter as a source of illustration. A new chapter has been added on the Dialects of Hindí, and the Maithilí, Mágadbí and Naipálí have been added to the dialects formerly presented, making the number exhibited in the revised edition to be fourteen. The section on the so-called Nominal Verbs, a subject but slightly treated in the former edition, has been greatly enlarged, and a large amount of other new matter has been added which cannot be mentioned in detail.

It is believed that the present edition, with its various improvements on the original Grammar, will be found to be deserving of the place which that work has for some time held among Grammars of the languages of
