**THE LIFE OF GRANVILLE GEORGE LEVESON GOWER,**

The subject of this work is the second Earl GRANVILLE, the friend and colleague of Mr. GLADSTONE. Lord EDMOND FITZMAURICE has had placed at his disposal the papers now in the possession of Lord GRANVILLE'S representatives, and he has in addition been given access to much of the correspondence of Lord GRANVILLE with the leading statesmen of the long period during which he took an active part in public affairs, including that of the DUKE OF DEVONSHIRE. The KING has also permitted numerous extracts from the letters of Queen VICTORIA and the PRINCE CONSORT to be published which throw important light on the views of her late Majesty upon foreign affairs, especially in regard to those of Germany. These, it is believed, will be read with the greatest interest, not only in England, but abroad.
