Buffalo Public Library
Music Collection

The music collection at the Buffalo Public Library has been assembled over a period of forty years, largely through the gifts of the musicians and music-lovers of Buffalo. Many names well known in music circles appear on the list of donors. But generous as have been the gifts, there are many serious gaps in the collection as a whole, as was bound to occur in a collection assembled in this manner. Through the generosity of Harry Cumpson, well known concert pianist, an effort is now being made to raise sufficient funds to purchase the scores needed to round out the collection, especially those of composers such as Bach, Beethoven and Brahms. The proceeds from the concert which Mr. Cumpson will give at the Library on November 6th will be devoted entirely to this purpose.
