## ADDITIONS AND NOTES.

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Page 17, line last, after *Norway*,

**A**LL these species of calcareous spar are called *phengitæ* in the Saxon mines.

Page 20, line *antepenult.* after *elsewhere*,  
Especially in all hot baths.

Page 21, line 8, after *dimensions*,

This species is likewise found in the neighbourhood of *Osterwalde*, in Lower Saxony.

After line last, add,

3. Solid stalactites, of a radiated texture.
  - a. In form of corals.
    1. White, abounds in the caverns of the steel-mines in Upper Stiria, and more scarce in the shaft of *Backen*, near Chemnitz in Hungary.

Page 24, line 3, after *opaque*,

In Spain we find this, and several other varieties of alabaster, which is very fine. The ancients have probably got their beautiful alabasters from thence.

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
