Page 17, line last, after Norway,

L L these species of calcareous spar are called phengitæ in the Saxon mines.

Page 20, line antepenult. after elsewhere, Especially in all hot baths.

Page 21, line 8, after dimensions,

This species is likewise found in the neighbour-hood of Osterwalde, in Lower Saxony.

After line last, add,

- 3. Solid stalactites, of a radiated texture.

 a. In form of corals.
 - 1. White, abounds in the caverns of the steel-mines in Upper Stiria, and more scarce in the shaft of Backen, near Chemnitz in Hungary.

Page 24, line 3, after opaque,

In Spain we find this, and several other varieties of alabaster, which is very fine. The ancients have probably got their beautiful alabasters from thence.
