THIS city contains about twenty thousand inhitants, who are a hardy race of people, and have much the appearce of the natives of the north of Europe: the complexion of my of them approaches almost to ruddy, but with those peculia expressive features which distinguish the middle and lower classes Andalusia. The fertile fields and productive gardens which surnd Ronda, afford to its people abundant means of subsistence; besinkine, oil, and corn, which they enjoy in common with other partithe province, they have a profusion of all the fruits and vegets of our more northern climate: the apples and pears with whithe trees are loaded, equal or excel in flavour those of our own cary; and the cities of Cadiz and Seville, while they are supplied woranges, lemons, grapes, and pomegranates, from their more immite vicinity, are furnished from this quarter with the vegetable ries of northern Europe.
