Both internal and external lustre is shining, which sometimes inclines to splendent, sometimes to glistening, and is intermediate between pearly and vitreous.

Cross fracture uneven and sometimes also small conchoidal, but in other directions soliated.

## Chemical Characters.

Lelievre afferts that it is fusible without addition into a white transparent glass, before the blow pipe. Other chemists affirm that it is completely infusible without addition. It does not form a gelly with acids, and, according to Hauy, when powdered and thrown on charcoal emits a greenish yellow phosphoric light.
