

The varieties with earthy fracture adhere to the tongue.

*Chemical Characters.*

It is infusible, without addition, before the blowpipe; with glass of borax it is reduced, and the glass acquires a hyacinth-red colour; and it is insoluble in cold nitric acid.

*Constituent Parts.*

It is conjectured to be an Arsenate of Nickel.

*Geognostic Situation.*

It occurs in veins in primitive and floetz rocks, along with copper-nickel, and black nickel ore, and other ores.

*Geographic Situation.*

It occurs at Leadhills and Wanlockhead; at Alva in Stirlingshire, and in Linlithgowshire; at Andreasberg in the Hartz; Riegelsdorf; in Saxony; and at Allemont in France.
