Friable Uran-Ochre.

External Characters.

It colour is straw-yellow, which passes sometimes in-
to sulphur-yellow and lemon-yellow; sometimes into
yellowish-brown and orange-yellow, and occasionally
borders on aurora red.

It occurs usually as a coating or efflorescence on pitch-
ore.

It is friable, and composed of dull, dusty, weakly soil-
ing, and weakly cohering particles.

It feels meagre, and is

Not particularly heavy.

It occurs always on pitch-ore.
