Of Br. Martin Macks, David Louis-  
borgers, & Gottfried Kuntz journey  
to Onondaga, from July 26<sup>th</sup> N. L. 1782.

Wed: July 26<sup>th</sup> In the evening after a fine dinner  
we set off from home with a load of baggage in  
a wagon, our attachment to our dear home  
was, shedding many tears. The watchword  
was, "and I shall put my trust in you, & ye shall  
live." <sup>Chr.</sup> Church: 37.14. Church: terrible holily.

Our dear friends Chr. Seidel, & Gottlieb accom-  
panied us to Christian's Brunns, where we came past  
midnight at light

Thurs: July 27<sup>th</sup> Towards noon we set off from Chr. Brunns  
Br. Moser went with us to a distance, from where  
we returned with many hearty salutations to our  
dear Br. & Mrs. & we went on our way with heavy  
& changed hearts, but went at a some time, working  
by dishes. Our bundles, tho' not very great, made  
us sweat much, it being very hot all day.

Sabb: July 29<sup>th</sup> About 10 in the forenoon, we reached  
Brunswick, & went directly to Mr. Schylon's, who  
was very glad, if we took this opportunity of vi-  
siting him. We brought him a letter from  
Br. Dorsch, at which both had the desired & hearty  
satisfaction. He presently offered to do what he  
was <sup>most</sup> willing to render us in any thing it was  
in his power; he gave us a Pass, as also a letter  
of recommendation to a Major of N. York. They  
desir'd us to relate to them a visit of a Indians,
