Edward Johnston hat durch sein Werk und das Werk seiner Schüler und deren Schüler die ganze heutige Schriftgestaltung in England entscheidend beeinflusst. Man begegnet diesem Einfluß auf Schritt und Tritt: bei den Straßenschildern, in den Kirchen, in den Schaufenstern, in den Druckschriften

Mary Ratcliffe, Mildred M. Ratcliffe, A. C. Gorham and T. W. Swindlehurst should be named. Edward Johnston's teaching has had a decisive influence on the revival of good lettering in England and as Mr. C. H. St. John Hornby has said - "the results of this revival meet the eye at every turn, in our streets, in our churches, in our shop-windows, in the books we read, in the advertisements in our newspapers and on our hoardings". Other countries also have profited by his teaching. Geheimrat Muthesius, the architect attached to the German Embassy in London, after his return to Berlin advised the Prussian Ministry of Commerce to invite him to lecture at a holiday course
