WOLFGANG AMERBACH

1907-1982

Wolfgang Amerbach (1907-1982) was a German composer and pianist. He studied at the University of Leipzig and the Conservatory of Leipzig. He composed several symphonies, concertos, and chamber music. He was a member of the German Democratic Republic (DDR) and the German Democratic Composers' Union.

Amerbach's music is characterized by a strong sense of rhythm and a clear melodic line. He was influenced by the works of Beethoven and Brahms. His music is often described as "classical" and "modern".

He composed several symphonies, including the "Symphony No. 1" and the "Symphony No. 2". He also composed several concertos, including the "Concerto for Piano and Orchestra" and the "Concerto for Violin and Orchestra".

Amerbach's music is often performed by orchestras and soloists. It is considered one of the most important works of the German Democratic Republic.
