### LATEST TELEGRAMS.

San Francisco, June 18. The Mayor, Mr. Schmitz, has been dismissed from office, having been found guilty of obtaining money from French hotel-keepers by blackmail.

St. Petersburg, June 18. The Imperial Council met today and the Czar's Manifesto dissolving the Duma was read aloud. After cheers for His Majesty, the Imperial Council was prorogued till November 24.

Berlin, June 18. The Lord Mayor and the members of the London City Council, under the guidance of Bürgermeister Dr. Raake, visited the Kaiser Friedrich Museum, the Pergamon Museum, and the Hand-workers' School. The guests afterwards went in a special train by underground railway to Charlottenburg, where they took luncheon. In welcoming the visitors Bürgermeister Metting reminded the company that on this day 92 years ago the English and Prussians fought side by side. The Lord Mayor in reply expressed the thanks of his party for the splendid reception accorded to them, and assured their hosts of the friendship of his countrymen for the German nation. Luncheon over, a visit was paid to the Forest School and Villa colony at Grunewald.

### KOEPENICK CAPTAIN'S FORTUNE.

The captain of Koepenick, William Voigt, has received £1,750 in donations from friends and admirers. When in three years' time, he is liberated at the age of sixty-seven, the *Morning Leader* says, fate has another joy in store for him. A rich old maid has formally offered to marry him. She also has bequeathed him £5,000 in the event of her dying before his release.
