LATEST AMERICAN MAIL NEWS. TO THE UNITED STATES. August 24.—Kronprinz Wilhelm, from Bremen, mails due in New York August 31. Mark letters "Via Bremen," and post not later than 1 o'clock p.m. tomorrow (Monday). August 26.—Teutonic, from Liverpool, mails due in New York September 2. Mark letters "Via England" and with name of steamer, and post not later than 1 o'clock p.m. tomorrow (Monday). August 26.—Kaiserin Auguste Victoria, from Hamburg, mails due in New York September 4. Mark letters "Via Hamburg," and post not later than 1 o'clock p.m. on Wednesday, August 25. August 29.—Lusitania, from Liverpool, mails due in New York September 3. Mark letters "via Colon—Queenstown per Cunard Line," and post in Berlin and Dresden not later than 1 o'clock p.m. on Thursday, August 25. August 28.—St. Paul, from Southampton, mails due in New York September 4. Mark letters "Via England" and with name of the steamer, and post not later than 1 o'clock p.m. on Thursday, August 25. TO CANADA. Letters destined for Canada it is advisable to send by one of the New York steamers, as they are likely to reach their destination more quickly than if despatched by one of the direct vessels from Liverpool to Montreal.

SPECIAL NOTICE Letters for the above steamers should be mailed in the boxes at the station (Berlin, Lehrter Bahnhof; Dresden, Hauptbahnhof) or at the General Post-office at the time mentioned. Letters bearing a 10-pfennig stamp per weight of 20 grammes are only valid for transit by a German steamer sailing direct from a German port. They will not be sent by an English or French steamer.
