Let no resident in Dresden who is in want of fresh air and companionable exercise forget, and to all passing visitors and others who don't already know be it hereby made known, that within 20 minutes of the heart of the city are the links of the Dresden Golf Club, in as picturesque a situation as golfer could desire. But let the Edinburgh *Scotsman* be the witness as to character. "The condition of the Dresden links," says a contributor to that authoritative journal at the end of July last, "is most promising, considering they are only two years old, and provides excellent sport. The chief hazards consist of the various tracks round the spacious racecourse—the sand track, the steeplechase track with its hedges and bullfinches, and the flat race track which must be crossed four times and is always out of bounds and lying in wait for sliced or pulled balls. The ninth green lies in the midst of a bewildering series of sand tracks, flat race and steeplechase tracks, roads and spinneys. The possibilities of going wrong here are very considerable and the delights of going right proportionately great. On the whole, the Dresden Golf links, with the delightful Clubhouse, form a charming addition to the arts and sciences that here abound, and they are doing much to enhance the already existing good fellowship in this gathering ground of all nations."

To add what the *Scotsman* did not know, because it had not then happened: Munich, a rival "art and science" city to Dresden, has lately established Golf Links on ground granted *gratis* for the purpose by the Municipality and laid out under the supervision of the Dresden Golf Club professional, Mr. Murray. A healthy rivalry in the "Royal and Ancient Game," as well as in the other "arts and sciences," may therefore be expected between the Saxon and Bavarian capitals; and we do not doubt that Dresden will maintain the lead she has obtained. We hear whispers of a forthcoming Golf Tournament in Dresden, but are not yet in a position to publish particulars.

During the important exhibitions held in Dresden in 1905 and 1908 by the district lodge Sachsen of the International Order of Good Templars, the wish was generally expressed that such exhibitions could be held from time to time in other towns, so that the provinces might be instructed and stimulated to take up the good work. The lodge Sachsen is now in a position to realise that wish, and has organised travelling exhibitions with the object of combating intemperance. The first tour will be made through the Erzgebirge and Vogtland within the next few weeks. Information on the subject will be gladly supplied by H. "ADVANCE AUSTRALIA!"

TO THE EDITOR OF THE DAILY RECORD.

I have come across an extract from the speech delivered by Mr. J. A. Coghlan, Agent General for New South Wales, at the Australian banquet in London on May 21st, 1909. I see that he spoke of the whole of Australia having a larger trade compared to its population than any country in the world, being £118,000,000 per annum, or £27.71 per inhabitant. The excess of exports over imports during the last five years averaged £20,000,000 per annum, and Sydney was the fourth port in the British Empire, surpassing in the value of its trade any city with the exception of London, Liverpool, and Hull, whilst only three other cities, Manchester, Glasgow, and Southampton, could claim superiority over Melbourne.
