- 362. Larger ditto, with imitation bark of tree outside, and Japanese characters sunk in gold.
- 363. Circular ditto, on stand, with gold leaves in centre.
 - 364. Square basket of crackled china.
- 365. Palissy dish, with raised and coloured flowers.
- 366. Quaint saké pot, with cup and stand, of yellow ornamented pottery.
- 367. Fantastic-shaped teapot, of brown ware.
- 368. Small saké jar, with figure of executioner carrying a criminal's head on a pole.
- 369. Japanese Palissy bowl, with flowers in relief (found at Yokohama).
- 370. Flower stand, of very rare kind; the inside of crackled china, and the outside made to imitate the bark of a tree. (No other specimen could be found in Osaca, Yedo, or Nagasaki. This came from Nagasaki, and is probably very old.)
- 371. Three small pottery flower-pots (three).

- Specimens of Porcelain and Pottery brought from Saki, a town between Osaca and Yedo, very celebrated for its china ware made in the neighbourhood; hence porcelain is called frequently Monosaki; literally, Saki products, or things of Ocasaki.
 - 372. Porcelain inkstand.
- 373. Two blue porcelain preserve jars, with covers.
 - 374. Two saké jars.
 - 375. Blue porcelain citron-shaped jars.
 - 376. Purple porcelain teapot.
 - 377. Five cups to match.
- 378. Another set of five, of different pattern. (The Japanese make all sets in fives or tens.)
 - 379. Set of ten white egg-shell ditto.
 - 380. Ditto, with coloured pattern.
 - 381. Two fine white porcelain bowls.
 - 382. Set of three ditto.
 - 383. Ditto, ditto.

D.—Bronzes and all Work in Metals.

- 384. Pair of large bronze jars, with altorelievo designs and dragon handles.
- 385. Pair of Etruscan-shaped vases, on elaborately wrought dragon stand.
 - 386. Pair of ditto, with basso-relievos.
- 387. A cylindrical vase, with alto-relievo dragon, and representation of waves.
- 388. An old bronze vase, with handles of antique and Etruscan form.
- 389 to 393. Five smaller specimens of modern vases.
- 394 to 396. Specimens of silver inlaid vases.
- 397. Imitation rustic rock-work, and shell for stand to a vase or cup.
- 398. Quaint device of rock-work and water, with gold fish supporting a large funnel-shaped vase for flowers.
- 399. Tripod stand for flat vases or bowl, with basso-relievo figures.
 - 400. Smaller ditto, of antique form.

- 401. A fine specimen, with storks in basso-relievo.
- 402. Bronze basket, wreathed with leaves and flowers, a fine specimen, of very old date.
 - 403. Bronze cage.
 - 404. Paper-weight.
 - 405. Vine-leaf hanging bronze flower jar-
 - 406. Hanging vase for flowers.
- 407. Ditto, in the shape of a gourd, incrusted with leaves and a scarabæus, used to hang against the pillars of a room with flowers.
 - 408. Ditto, ditto.
- 409. Ditto, of more modern art, with graceful grouping of leaves.
- 410. Hanging vase of fine bronze, with moveable handles for packing.
- 411. Antique and elaborately-chased bronze vase for flowers, with dragon ornaments, said to contain a large alloy of silver.
 - 412, 413. Flower-stands.
