NORTH CENTRAL COURT.

KENDALL, H. Consul for Peru, 11, *New Broad St. E. C.*—

1. Silver ores, from the mines at Cerro de Pasco.
2. Quicksilver ore, from the mines of Huancavelica.
3. Nitrate of soda, or cubic nitre, from Iquique.
4. Borax from the same district.
5. Guano from the Chincha Islands.
6. Remarkable specimen of guano, containing a pure white crystallised ammoniacal salt.
7. Cascarilla, or Peruvian bark, from Huanuco.
8. Coca-leaf from Huanuco; it supports Indian miners and couriers under great fatigue with very little food.
9. Matico-leaves, a very powerful styptic and astringent.
10. Sarsaparilla from the department of Piura.
11. Large maize from Cuzco, in grain and in the ear.
12. Rice from Lambayeque and San Pedro.
13. Coffee from the mountains near Huanuco.
14. Samples of sheep's wool from Junin and Puno.
15. Alpaca wool from Arequipa and Puno.
16. White alpaca skin.
17. Llama and Vicuña, or Vigonia wools.

18. Silver vessel, from the ruins of the ancient Indian city of Grand Chimu.
19. Silver hammer, seals, buttons, and medals, from the same ruins.
20. Drinking cup mounted in silver.
21. Poncho of Peruvian cotton, made by Indians.
22. Small piece of poncho cloth, taken from an Indian grave some centuries old.
23. Jaquima, or halter of plaited hide, mounted in silver.
24. Wooden stirrups mounted in silver.
25. Ancient stirrups of carved wood mounted in silver.
26. Crupper of stamped leather.
27. Four huaqueros, or earthen jars.
28. A face carved in wood, from the ruins of the Temple of the Sun at Pachacamac.

ELIAS, DON D. *Estate at Nasca.*—

29. Cotton from Nasca, producing 1,200,000 lbs. yearly: it might be 3,000,000 lbs.
30. Cochineal from Nasca; annual produce, 50,000 lbs.
31. Wine from Hoyos, near Pisco, similar to Madeira wine; annual produce, 100,000 gallons.
32. Wine from Urrutia estate, near Pisco; Annual produce, 200,000 gallons.
33. Aguardiente Italia, produced at Yca, near Pisco; a liqueur made from Muscatel grape.
