Upon the King's Divorce the Pope threatned him with Excommunication unless he would revoke all that he had done. Gardiner Bp. of Winton about this Time and upon this Occasion was sent Ambassador to the French King and Bonner Soon after followed him to Marseilles, where Gardiner was now at the Interview
