

But with much ado. For at first, he was not only forbid, to read his Lectures, but not to stir a Foot out of the City of *Oxon*, nor to convey any of his Goods away. He obeyed and afterwards was permitted by the Council, to depart. However he thought not fit, to transport himself without Leave from the Government. He signified to them, that he came not hither on his own Head, but that he was sent for by K. *Edward* and sent from the Town of *Strasburgh* and produced his Broad-Seals from both and so since there was no further need of him, he desired Leave, to depart, which he obtained by Letters from the Queen herself. But the Papists cried out, that such an Enemy of the Popish Religion ought not to be dismissed, but to be fetched out of the Ship and carried to Prison and punished. He understood also by his Friends, that when he was got over the Sea, the Danger was not past. For there were Snares for him in *Flanders* and *Brabant*, whereby they made no Doubt, to take him. Therefore when other Congregations of Protestant Strangers went straight some for *Freezland* and some for *Denmark*, by Vessels they had hired, among which was *John a Lasco's* Congregation, he procured
