

A servant being aware of the embezzlements and thefts of her fellow-servant, and omitting to give information of them to her employers renders herself culpable as an accomplice.

Every servant is obliged to submit to her boxes and chests being opened for examination by her employers, in presence of herself and a witness.

Orders, and reproofs for faults must be accepted by a servant with respect and modesty.

Reproachful words, or slight bodily correction to the servant occasioned by disrespectful, saucy behaviour to her employers do not furnish a case for legal proceedings.

The amount of wages and the manner of paying them, with or without board, depends entirely on the agreement made between the two parties at the time of hiring.

A servant can only claim Christmas presents on the ground of an express promise. By having given once or several times such a present to a servant, of their own free will, the employers do not bind themselves to continue that kind of liberality.

If the servant is on board she is entitled to good and sufficient food.

On Sundays and Holidays time must be allowed to a servant to attend church, to take care of her own affairs, and to mend her clothes and linen.

For servants engaged by the month the lawful day of entering service is the first of each month.
