

Six week's notice of leave must be given to a servant engaged for a quarter or longer. If hired by the month, notice must be given on the first of a month; whereupon the servant will leave on the first of the next month.

A servant may be dismissed at once without previous notice:

1) If she has insulted her employer or his family by using bad language, slandering, injurious reports, or violence.

2) If she persists in disobedience and obstinacy to the commands of her employer.

3) If she misleads the children of her employer to evil deeds and bad practices.

4) If she, by bad conduct or negligence, exposes the children, intrusted to her care, to danger.

5) If she commits theft or larceny, or omits giving information of such offences committed by a fellow-servant, as come to her knowledge.

6) If she has borrowed money or goods in the name of her employers without their knowledge.

7) If she has repeatedly stayed out of the house over night without permission.

8) If she carelessly handles fire and light.

9) If she intentionally either from malice or wantonness has damaged the property of her employers.

10) If she has produced forged testimonials on being engaged.

A seryant who arbitrarily quits her employers before the expiration of her term without any lawful cause may be compelled, by calling in the

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
