doubt the efficacy of this vehicle of publicity of his own accord, the strange practices of certain publishers, certain advertising agents and touts must finally have caused him to begin to doubt the honesty and respectability of the advertising business. He must really have asked himself: "advertisements, always advertisements?" And in answer, he sought new and different methods of capturing customers.

Thus at last came the great turn-about-face. Hundreds of newspapers and periodicals vanished, hundreds went into "Gleichschaltung", which might best be described as intellectual goose-step (losing most or all of their subscribers in the process), hundreds rose up anew or took a new lease of life for the moment. These processes of change lasted for months and are by no means concluded to-day. The new laws respecting editorial staffs, propaganda, regulations of all sorts are not yet so far advanced that the new face of the press can be clearly discerned. He who had
