Chorley Wood Common is near Chorley Wood Station, on the Metropolitan Line. A three-mile stroll brings you to Dawes Common, with remarkable views of the River Chess below. Cheap return tickets to the Chiltern country are issued, daily, from all stations on the Metropolitan and East London

lines. On Sundays and Bank Holidays by all trains. On Mondays to Fridays between 10 and 4. Saturdays by all trains after 10. Chorley Wood Station (return fare 2/6) is 35 minutes from Baker Street or Marylebone (L.N.E.R.) Stations.

Bacombe Hill begins near Wendover Station, on the Metropolitan Line, and rises gradually until it reaches Coombe Hill, the headland which, at 352 feet, is the highest point in the Chilterns. Cheap day return tickets to the Chiltern country are issued, daily, from all stations on the Metropolitan and East London Lines.

On Sundays and Bank Holidays by all trains. Mondays to Fridays between 10 and 4. Saturdays by all trains after 10. The cheap day return fare to Wendover Station is 4/3 from Baker Street (Metropolitan Line) or Marylebone (L.N.E.R.)

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
