The pictures of the Colombian photographer, Luis B. Ramos, reveal all the enchantment of a distant and unique world. They are splendid photographs of Indian tribal types and the amazing features of mountain scenery on the Equator. In addition there are interesting glimpses of pompous or idyllic old Spanish architecture. Among the typical faces of the land of the Cordilleras, one discovers many with an age-old and strangely fascinating expression. The incarnation of fanaticism or the ripeness of time is depicted in others, while some expressions display a sagacity that is innate. Bogota, Colombia's extremely isolated capital, is 2600 metres above sea-level. Its altitude is not the only extraordinary feature of this remarkable city, which has been the subject of so many fabulous tales in Europe. The reality, charmingly presented by the photographer in many pictures, will probably prove even more
