where they were wrapped in blankets and sat in front of the fire with their feet in tubs of hot water. Then having got nice and warm they were put to bed where they slept hours and hours.

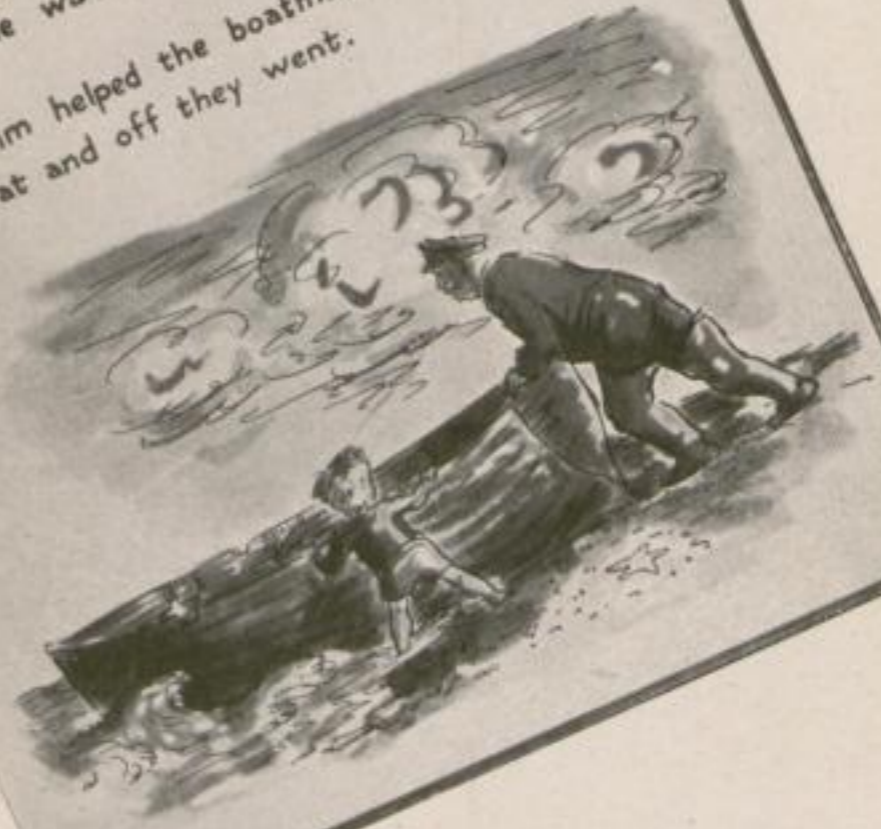
