which may be considered the best ever produced for one of Goethe's works, for they are in absolute harmony with the spirit and atmosphere of the Elegies. The vignettes too are impressively symbolical. However, Yngve Berg does not devote himself exclusively to classicist designs. His versatility is evident in his other work to mention only his pen drawings to "Dans Minnen" which show the remarkable power with which the artist can depict the human body in motion. Study trips to Vienna, Prague, Venice, Paris, Greece and Spain enriched Yngve Berg's experiences. A Greek travel book

and "Hellas und Hisperien" by Emil Zilliacus contain some delightful landscapes and pictures of Greek national life.
