

buried in the disproportionately bulky volumes of the Hexapla and the Tetrapla. It was predominant, according to Jerome, in Palestine at about 400 A. D.

9. Jerome mentions yet a third recension. This is to be traced back to a certain Hesychius, about whom we know little, and it prevailed in Egypt at about 400 A. D. It had been presumably by that time in existence for about a century. No conclusive information is yet to be had with regard to this third recension.

10. Origen's text is indicated by *O*, that of Lucian by *L*, another somewhat later recension, which is to be found in the big Catena in XVI prophetas, by *C*.
